The Australian Education System

The Australian education system provides primary, secondary and tertiary education.

School education (Primary and Secondary)

School education (primary and secondary) is similar across all of Australia with only minor variations between states and territories. School education is compulsory between the ages of six and sixteen (Year 1 to Year 9 or 10). School education is 13 years and divided into:

- Primary school Runs for seven or eight years, starting at Kindergarten/Preparatory through to Year 6 or 7.
- **Secondary school** Runs for three or four years, from Years 7 to 10 or 8 to 10.
- **Senior secondary school** Runs for two years, Years 11 and 12.

Tertiary education

Tertiary education includes both higher education (including universities) and vocational education and training (VET).

Language of instruction

English is the official language of Australia and the main language of instruction in the education system. Many schools offer bilingual programs or programs in other languages.



Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF)



The Australian education system is distinguished from many other countries by the Australian Qualifications Framework (http://www.agf.edu.au/). The AQF was established in 1995 and is a national policy that covers qualifications from the tertiary education sector (higher education and vocational education and training) in addition to the school-leaving certificate, the Senior Secondary Certificate of Education.

The AQF has 10 levels and links school, vocational and university education qualifications into one national system. This allows you to move easily from one level of study to the next and from one institution to another, as long as you satisfy student visa requirements. It allows for choice and flexibility in career planning. All qualifications in the AQF help prepare you for both further study and your working life.

If you are studying an AQF qualification, you can be sure that your institution is government-authorised and nationally accredited, and that your degree or other AQF qualification will be genuine.

Australian institutions are linked across the country and across the world, which makes it easy to move throughout the education system between courses or institutions and formal agreement and recognition frameworks mean every step of the path will contribute to your future no matter what your study or career goals.

Lawson College Australia accredited qualifications are aligned with the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) and approved by the Vocational Education and Training (VET) accreditation authority, Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA). As part of the VET Quality Framework, Lawson is compliant with the AQF.

Public Transport

myki is Melbourne's ticket to travel on the city's trains, trams and buses.

International and interstate visitors coming to Victoria can buy a full fare or concession myki Visitor Pack from the Melbourne Visitor Centre at

Federation Square or from the PTV Hub at Southern Cross Station near the corner of Spencer and Collins streets or ask at your hotel.

The **myki** visitor pack includes a durable myki smartcard pre-loaded with enough credit for one day's travel in Zone 1, which includes the entire tram network. It also includes discounts and offers at 15 of Melbourne's leading attractions, saving visitors more than \$130.



acilities and Resources

Lawson College Australia premises are situated at 2/228 Lonsdale Street and 53 Walker Street, Dandenong, Melbourne Victoria. Students have easy access to Dandenong from surrounding suburbs with an excellent train and bus service. It is a 10-minute walk to the Lawson College Australia premises from the Dandenong Railway Station with a bus stop at the rear of the premises. Lawson College Australia premises offer the perfect study

environment for all our students.



Lawson College Australia facilities include a library/computer lab; lecture and tutorial rooms; clinical practice/ simulation laboratory; tea room and student lounge.

The 'common room' provides students an ideal area within the building to relax, socialise with other students and have their meals. Students also have full access to fridges, kettles, microwaves, toaster ovens and sandwich presses. This allows students to bring food from home and save money. Toilet/washroom facilities (including disabled toilet) are available in the premises.

Classrooms

All classrooms are equipped with cooling and heating facilities. Classrooms are furnished with comfortable and appropriate furniture and equipment to foster effective learning.

Computers and Laptops

At Lawson College Australia you will have full use of computers provided in the computer lab. However, we do expect students to bring their own personal laptops. Our student administration contact and communication, and our Student Learning Management system is compatible with the operating systems common in Australia. Students will be provided with a generic username and password if they wish to use the Lawson College Australia computers. Printing/scanning facilities are also available in the computer lab.

Lawson College Australia utilises the Student Learning Management system Moodle and facilitates training through the use of face-to-face classes and Cloud Learning @ Lawson.

Library

The Lawson College Australia library is equipped with an excellent selection of textbooks. Students can borrow books, use the photocopier and the adjacent Study area for personal study. Many relevant texts can be sourced in the City of Greater Dandenong library which is located within an easy two-minute walk from both campuses.

Wireless internet

Wireless internet is available throughout the Lawson College Australia premises.

Students can obtain the free Wi-Fi access.

Living in a new city means you have to get used to the cost of living. An example of accommodation costs is outlined below. This information is intended as a guide only and is not an exhaustive list. Before moving to another country, it is important to know the cost of living (accommodation, food, travel etc.) Make this a major part of your planning so that you can live comfortably and within your budget while you study.

Once you arrive, local people will also be happy to help you find the best and the cheapest food, rent and other necessities.

Cost of living

As a general guide, accommodation, food, transport, clothes and expenses could cost between AUD\$20,000 – AUD\$25000 or more a year. Some prices for common items are listed here. Compare supermarkets and local markets, as quality and price can vary. Prices are in Australian dollars, are approximate only, and can vary significantly.

Renting a room: \$120-\$180 per week

Part-time job up to 20 hours a week: \$100-\$350 per week

Groceries: \$50-\$80 a week 1 packet of noodles: \$1.50

1 kg rice: \$3-\$4 1 kg fresh fruit: \$3-\$5 1 litre of milk: \$1-\$2.50

Pre-paid mobile phone contract: around \$30 per month

Transport pass, weekly, zone 1: \$30.20

1 liter petrol: \$1.20 - \$1.50

Student Safety

Lawson College Australia has a number of processes to provide a safe and secure learning environment to all students. These include hours of operation and access to staff to assist students where required.

When travelling to and from Lawson College Australia premises it is important to ensure your own safety at all times.

Student Safety Tips:

- Don't openly carry valuables, including expensive gadgets, mobile phones, laptops, etc
- find suitable and safe routes to petrol stations, shops and your local police station. Try to find routes that are well lit and busy
- avoid confrontation it is better and safer to walk away if you are being provoked
- if you feel you are being followed, cross the street, and if you are still worried, move as quickly as possible to a public area (such as a restaurant) and then telephone for help
- at night, walk in pairs in well-lit areas and on busier streets, not dark alleyways and side-streets
- have your keys ready well before you reach the door of your car or house
- if you are going away, tell someone you trust where you are going and when you will be back
- if travelling by bus or tram at night, try not to wait alone at the bus or tram stops
- arrange for others to meet you at your home stop if you are returning late and have a long way to walk
- if you are travelling by train at night, do not sit in an empty carriage. Try to sit near groups of people in a well-lit area
- check the time of the last train, bus or tram home to avoid being stranded at night
- avoid walking alone after getting off public transport at night. If you can, walk close to a group of people or arrange for someone to meet you.

- Temporary accommodation
- Rental accommodation
- Share accommodation
- Homestay (involves living with a family who provide board and the opportunity for cultural exchange)

At Lawson College Australia, student support staff can also assist you to secure temporary accommodation (single night or longer) at your expense.

If you would like to use this service, you may do so by requesting and submitting the 'Accommodation booking request form' at least 4 weeks prior to your arrival date to ensure your accommodation booking is confirmed.

When deciding on accommodation, you might consider short-term (single night or longer) accommodation in a hotel/motel for a few nights until you settle in. Otherwise a month of homestay, student accommodation or even a hostel is a good temporary option. This allows you time to settle in and to look for more permanent accommodation.



Check rental property lists from real estate offices or download these from their websites. You might choose to get together with friends and rent a house or flat/apartment independently. You will probably need referrals when renting privately so make sure you arrange these in advance.

Once you have chosen a suburb you would like to live in, use an online map to check:

- How far is the accommodation from the city, or your educational institution?
- How far is it to the bus, tram or train? Are there bike paths nearby?
- Is it within walking distance of supermarkets and shops?
- How much is the bond?
- If it is a share household, is there a regular cash collection for basic items like sugar, toilet paper and cleaning products?
- Is food shared or does everyone buy their own?
- How are domestic tasks like cleaning allocated?

Explore your options carefully by learning as much as you can about the area you are going to live in. You'll need to consider services and facilities, your budget and its convenience to getting to your place of study.

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)

It is mandatory for all international students to have valid overseas health insurance (OSHC) for the full period of their visa. Further assistance is available from the Student support office or alternatively you can visit the following website: https://oshcaustralia.com.au/en

As an international student on a student visa, you must be covered by Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the duration of your studies. Lawson College Australia uses Medibank for its OSHC. http://www.medibank.com.au

When you apply to Lawson College Australia you have the opportunity to purchase an OSHC policy. By accepting and paying for the OSHC policy through Lawson College you are agreeing to the terms, conditions and policies on the Medibank OSHC website. It is your responsibility to ensure that your OSHC is always paid for the duration of your student visa. The start date, end date, cost and policy type are located on your 'Letter of Offer'. Your membership details will be posted directly to Lawson College Australia or your nominated Australian address. You will need to show your card when you visit a doctor.

Using your OSHC Policy

Your OSHC policy covers you when you need to visit a doctor or go to a hospital. OSHC covers 100 per cent of the government scheduled fee. Some doctors will charge slightly more than the government scheduled fee. You will also be covered if you are treated in a public hospital. OSHC provides members with access to a 24/7 emergency phone service that offers:

- Emergency medical advice and assistance
- an interpreter where necessary
- referrals to doctors and medical centres
- access to a solicitor for general legal advice and referrals
- phone assistance to replace travel documents or passports.

To seek assistance from a doctor you will need to visit a medical clinic. There are many suitable clinics that provide general, and specialist medical services located near Lawson College Austalia, Dandenong campus. At the clinic, you will need to register at reception and will be asked to provide your contact information and OSHC details. Not all medical services can be direct billed, so check with your OSHC provider for the details of your

Most medical clinics require you to make an appointment to see a doctor. The advantage of making an appointment is that you will be able to see a doctor of your choice at a time that suits you.

Important note:

Students must be a minimum age of 18 years or more in order to enrol into programs offered by Lawson College Australia. Some courses have additional entry requirements.

Education agents

STEP 1 Complete an International Student Application Form

Once the applicant has established their eligibility for the course, they should complete the 'Application for admission and enrolment' which can be downloaded from the Lawson College Australia website at: http://lawsoncollege.edu.au/applying/, or on request by contacting Lawson College Australia at admissions@lawsoncollege.edu.au.

STEP 2 Apply for Course Credit

All applicants have the opportunity to apply for course credit. Individuals can apply for course credit during the time of enrolment.

- 1. If a student wishes to apply for course credit they must complete the 'Course Credit Application' document with the required information (such as detailed records of their experience, employment, training, etc., which may be relevant).
- 2. The 'Course Credit Application form' will specify the units to be completed and students will be required to identify how they address the elements of each unit included in the Course Credit Application.
- 3. Once the Course Credit Application form is completed, they are required to submit this with associated evidence to the student administration. This Course Credit Application and evidence is to be assessed by an assessor and the student is to be notified of the outcome.

STEP 3 Enrolment Documents Verification

Lawson College Australia will assess whether the student's qualifications, experience and English language proficiency meet the entry requirements for the course for which enrolment is sought.

All relevant documents provided by the student will be assessed and verified by the Qualification and Admission Team. An enrolment information checklist will be completed for each application received.

STEP 4 Letter of Offer [Student Written Agreement] Issuance

- 1. A letter of offer will be issued to the successful applicant, or:
- 2. A letter with request to provide further documents in order to meet the entry requirements will be issued to the applicant.

STEP 5 Accepting the Letter of Offer

On receipt of the letter of offer, the applicant must read and understand the terms and conditions of the admissions and enrolment process. If the applicant agrees with the terms and conditions of the admission and enrolment they should sign the 'Course acceptance form' as well as 'Student written agreement' which will be attached to the 'letter of offer'.

STEP 6 Confirmation of Enrolment

On receipt of the tuition fee and signed acceptance form an electronic copy of the 'Confirmation of enrolment' (CoE) will be issued for visa purposes.

Please note that on accepting the offer applicants is entering into an agreement with Lawson College Australia. The agreement also serves to confirm the applicant's eligibility to enrol into the course.

STEP 7 Orientation Day

Lawson College Australia provides a **compulsory** orientation program for newly enrolled students prior to the commencement of each course. During orientation course registration will be completed and each student will participate in number of compulsory activities. Please follow your orientation schedule at the time of your admissions and enrolment.
